I must give a big shout-out to our Staff for helping us successfully navigate through all the challenges thrown at us by the pandemic. Kathleen, Julie plus the summer staff and interns have done an amazing job.

We undertook restoration of the verandah deck this fall and it nears completion as I type this. Combined with a new outdoor exhibit to be launched in November, the outdoor space will be lovely in the spring when we can replant the gardens which were removed for the restoration work. All visitors aged 12 and older must show proof of COVID-19 vaccination along with valid ID

In accordance with the province's vaccine certificate policy, all staff, volunteers, and visitors aged 12 and older are required to show proof of vaccination upon entering Hillary House National Historic Site effective Wednesday, September 22, 2021.

In order to be considered fully vaccinated, you must have received your second shot at least 14 days before your visit. You can present either a paper or digital copy of your vaccination receipt, along with supporting ID that includes your name and date of birth.

We continue with other safety measures including screening, mandatory face masks, physical distancing, and limited capacity. Thank you for your support and cooperation.

The AHS wears two hats – the programming is the Aurora Historical Society – speakers, teas, workshops, events, exhibits, tours, etc. Hillary House is where we do it (mostly). Of course, the AHS has a huge duty of care as owners of the Hillary House property.

We have some big tasks ahead of us in 2022 at Hillary House. We have to tackle some much-need repair and restoration. This is why fundraisers such as the Hillary House Ball and Auction are so important.

Garden Discoveries

Have you ever been gardening and happened upon something strange in the dirt? Well, that's exactly what happened when Landscape Committee volunteers were gardening at Hillary House this summer! In preparation for the restoration of the verandah, the flowers and plants around the front of Hillary House needed to be removed. While digging out the plants, two strange discoveries were made. Amongst all the dirt was a long nail and an old knife. We cannot be sure who they belonged to, how long they've been there, or how they got there, but they've probably been waiting to be found for a while. Both the nail and the knife are significantly corroded

and there is very little in the way of distinguishing marks. There is one visible marking on the knife which tells us that it is a "Premier H 13" knife. With this information we were able to discover that the knife was likely made in Sweden in the 1940s.

Next time you visit Hillary House make sure to keep an eye out; there's always new pieces of history waiting to be uncovered.



Filming at Hillary House





Headlines From History Evening Star - September 1899

"In the General Sessions to-day John Glen was convicted of stealing an overcoat owned by A. Harris, of Aurora, from a livery in Aurora."

Toronto Daily Star - September 1902

"Aurora and Newmarket played a game of baseball on Saturday, in which a record for that part of the country was established. Reid and O'Brien of the St. Mary's of Toronto were in the points for Aurora. Only 28 of the Newmarket men faced Reid, who struck out 23 batters. He only allowed two scratchy hits, never gave a base on balls, and never struck a man. The score was 11 to 0 in favour of Aurora."

AHS Thanks the Ontario Trillium Foundation and the Government of Ontario

In 2021, the AHS received a \$36,000 Capital grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation to partially fund restoration work on the verandah deck of Hillary House, a 159-year-old National Historic Site. The project will be completed in November and will provide improved structural safety to the verandah space, allowing for increased programming space and public access to the museum for years to come. With its reputation as one of the best and most complete examples of Gothic Revival architecture in all of Canada, the verandah at Hillary House is one of the most important features.

Additionally, the AHS received a \$21,300 Resilient Communities Fund grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation to start the pandemic recovery process and begin rebuilding in response to the impacts of COVID-19. With this grant, the AHS was able to adapt and reimagine fundraising initiatives and heritage programming that follow COVID-19 safety protocols in order to raise revenue to ensure the financial viability of the Historical Society in 2021 and beyond.
